Guest Speakers

Perry Mixter, Vice President of Development @ The Arts and Science Council

Mr. Mixter spoke to us about what the organization does, they donate over \$13,000,000 to 26 cultural partners in Charlotte-Mecklenburg that give everyone an opportunity to enjoy a vibrant cultural life. More than half the budget goes to provide operating funds for organizations that are essential to our cultural core; from helping to pay the salaries of professional performers to keeping the lights on in museums. Charlotte-Mecklenburg's cultural sector generates \$202.8 million annually, supports 6,240 full-time jobs, generates \$18.1 million in local and state government revenues and provides more than 3.9 million customer experiences.

Ken Joyner, Assessor for Mecklenburg County

Mr. Joyner spoke to us about the recently mailed out notices of valuation that had gone out to our residents. He has been employed as Mecklenburg Tax Assessor since October 2013; prior to that, he taught appraisal at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill.

He gave us a history of the 2011 Reappraisal. North Carolina General Statues requires each county to conduct a county-wide reappraisal of all property every eight years. The process has two objectives: value properties at current market prices as of the date of the reappraisal, and equitably distribute the cost of local government among all property owners. Prior to the 2011, the last revaluation for Mecklenburg County was in 2003; thus the county was required by state law to have another no later than 2011. In response to concerns about 2011 property values (due to the Great Recession), the NC General Assembly required a total and complete review of all properties in Mecklenburg County. In September 2013 Pearson's Appraisal Services

was hired as an independent contractor to conduct the review. The review began in October 2013 and expected to be complete in February 2015.

Properties with an increase in value may receive a bill for additional taxes with no penalties. Properties with a decrease in value may be due a refund with interest from the date the original taxes were paid. The county has processed approximately 177,000 refunds and 64,000 additional tax bills.

Historically Mecklenburg County has conducted reappraisals more often than the required eight year period to avoid drastic property value changes that occur in the market over an eight year period. With the additional work required of the 2011 appraisal it is felt the next reappraisal for Mecklenburg County would not occur before 2018. One resident addressed the concern of flood zone properties in the neighborhood being unfairly valued at the same lot valuation of those parcels outside flood zones. Mr. Joyner requested the HOA secretary send email a list of which streets are in the flood zone and the office would review to verify that issue was addressed in the valuation.
