I think our neighbors will greatly enjoy the changes that are forthcoming. A community meeting to discuss the rezoning petition is scheduled for Wednesday, May 13th at 7:00 pm at the YWCA on Park Road. Matt and/or Lyle will be coming to our June 8th meeting to present details of the changes coming to the center. There will be a bank, and two restaurants replacing the existing building.
- All attendees were reminded / encouraged to get their hand painted and added to the mural on the wall of the media center. Artist Bree Stalling has been commissioned to do a mural regarding the history of Pinewood Elementary and Madison Park. The mural should be finished for all to see by our next meeting
