# Speakers

### Chris Snodgrass, Black Hawk Hardware on DIY Tree banding

The City of Charlotte recommends tree banding trees that are susceptible to cankerworms. If done properly tree bands can catch 90% of the worms. The process takes approximately 10 minutes per tree. First you put up 6" roll of insulation, making sure it gets into all the crevices of the tree, so the worms cannot crawl under the roll; then apply roofing felt over the insulation and attaching to the tree either by duct tape or staples. Duct tape does no damage to the tree. Afterwards, apply tanglefoot (adhesive goop) in 2" band over the roofing felt. The time to do this is after the tree has dropped all leaves, otherwise the tanglefoot will only catch leaves and NOT cankerworms. Keep the bands on the tree until late April to catch new worms going up the tree. The approximate cost is \$15/11b tub of tanglefoot, \$6 insulation and \$25 for roofing felt. He recommends doing it in clothes that will be destroyed; if you try washing the tanglefoot off the clothes you may damage your washing machine.

### Dennis Richter, Richter Development

Mr. Richter specializes in urban infield redevelopment and repurposing properties that adds to a neighborhood. He has been in Charlotte since 1981 and has repurposed properties in several neighborhoods. Currently his company has options to purchase 6 of the 8 houses between Halstead and Drexmore which fronts E Woodlawn Road. His redevelopment plans include replacing the 6 houses with 40 three-story townhomes. The townhomes will range from 1300 – 2000 square feet with the lowest level including a garage / flex space; 2<sup>nd</sup> story will have living / dining /kitchen with the 3<sup>rd</sup> story housing the bedrooms. Some units will have single garage and some dual garages and there will be additional visitor parking. The units will sell at a price point similar to the neighborhood and range from \$250,000 to \$400,000. Units will be brick / siding with some type of mid-century modern design with each unit having a courtyard. There will be a brick perimeter wall on the Woodlawn side with privacy fencing and planting around the other perimeters. No amenities will be offered in the development.
