Officer Mohammed from CMPD—crime report

- 82 year old, hearing impaired victim was the victim of a B/E on the 5300 block of Baker Dr. She believes that her nephew was involved. She kicked him out a month ago. Hidden money that only someone that knew her would have known about and TV gone.
- Larceny of a trimmer. 5000 Baylor Dr. Trimmer left in the back of a truck and victim came back and it was gone in the span of about 30 min.

- Signed warrants on Michael Bell (name?). Arrested prior 2 B/Es. He's back out.
- 2 B/Es in nearby neighborhood on Memorial Day weekend. Nice handprint left on back door and warrants have been signed for arrest and have contacted their parole officer to have parole revoked.

#### Questions

1. Rape on Park Rd. Victim hanging out on Montford and left her friends. She was intoxicated and walking home. She noticed a guy following her. She pretends to be on the phone. He calls to her. She ignored him. He caught up to her and the event did happen per her story. She says she fought him off and he fled. She described him as a stocky Asian male. Kit done at the hospital and expect DNA report soon. Note: Off duty police officers do patrol Montford Dr. on Friday and Saturday night every weekend. Don't walk home by yourself. Call someone if you feel something is off.
2. Seems to be a reduction of B/Es in the neighborhood. Is that true? Yes, there have been a reduction in B/Es in this neighborhood. Some nearby areas have been getting hit harder and resources have been sent to those areas.

- Don't post requests looking for house sitters, dog sitters, etc.

#### Code Enforcement (Dennis)

- Problems lately with high weeds and grass. There is a difference between the folks that habitually can't get their grass cut and someone that missed it one weekend. Be a kind neighbor.

#### Question

- Who do you talk to about traffic impediments (i.e. cars, bushes blocking the road)? Dennis can't do anything about cars. If there is no 'No Parking' sign on the street then folks can legally park there. If they are parked on the lawn or it's an abandoned vehicle then Dennis can tag it. If foliage isn't impeding the sidewalk then they can't do anything about it. Once foliage is impeding the sidewalk then call code enforcement. Call DOT if you want a 'No Parking' sign put up.

#### Stacy Raynor: Queens Facilities update

Stacy met with parks and rec about the recent construction in that area. Currently they're building 13 tennis courts and locker room facilities. We can't do anything about the project happening now because it's a done deal. Lee Jones (parks and recs development) is who Stacy met with. For future:

- Stacy got the meeting because of reports of erosion due to the construction and apparently they are doing everything they need to per the code. They've fixed things that led to the reported issues.
- There are plans to add another practice field which would reduce the woods area down the road. There will be a community meeting once more information is known to share the plan, talk about the changes to both the neighborhood and woods. Please keep your eye out on communications about coming out in the coming months/years. No timeframe was given on this project.
- Note: When talking to this team you have to be careful of the terminology. The woods are not protected. They consider the "buffer" the creeks and streams. The woods are separate from the buffer.
- How to preserve the trails back there. Gwen Cook from the greenway team is proposing a paved greenway trail to start at Keystone, go through Marion Diehl, and eventually connect to Little Sugar Creek, which would then link up to the Steel Creek greenway. Applying for a grant now.
- Kudos to the TrailBlazers for ensuring that there are trails back there. Christopher Matthews was there and he's in charge of natural resources. How can we control and preserve that environment (i.e. clear trails of debris, trash, overgrown poison ivy)? Parks and Rec does have a team that will help and provide guidance but they will not do the work. If we want for volunteers to do the work then they can help.
- When Stacy talked with them he took away that they didn't know that our neighborhood had issues with them reducing the woods there. Stacy took his voice as one person to this team but has volunteered to help be the voice of the neighborhood, and he extended the offer tonight to also carry the voice of Selwyn Park neighborhood forward as well.
