Animal Control Representative

- Stats for our area Jan 1 September 8th 2016 we had 11 animal attacks in our area of 28209 in 2015 around the same time we had 12 so we are decreasing. It's minor and major attacks. (Just K-9 attacks)
- Not a huge uptick in k-9 attacks in the area.
- Did they determine how the dogs got out? Two owners, same household. There were some problems with their fencing and that is house the dogs got out.
- Dogs of the recent attacks were euthanized.
- 7 year old boy was attacked by 3 Bull terriers in our neighborhood. Dogs were surrendered to the police. Dogs were 5 blocks from where the dogs actually lived. Owners were penalized and are due to appear in court. Dogs were up to date on all their shots.
- In general the leash law states that dogs need to be on their leash when off their property. Call 311 to report if you see a dog off leash.
- Municode.com for more information about every city ordinance for animal control
- Owners with dogs must take responsibility to ensure their dogs will not get out if they always get out.
- The owners of the dogs have two other dogs that were not involved they were issued a strict confinement orders for the remaining two dogs.
- Call 311 if you see an owner and their dog is off leash. Taking a picture of the offense will work for a civil hearing if the other denies the offense.
- The officers have to see or witness the animal off leash.
- If you have any questions on Animal care and control, call 311 and they will transfer you
 over.

- The soccer practice field to the East of the Tennis Court Project is still on the Master Plan but given the current topology and lay of the land it the project will get deprioritized and can still happen but it will be down the road if it does. As discussed- if Queens moves closer to working on the project and clearing more woods- then Queens would work to communicate the project with the neighborhoods of Madison Park and Selwyn Park
- The Track and Field Area is going to get a project that would redo the field and turn it into a Field Hockey area and add a Field House that would land to the west of the track and require some of the woods to be removed that is west of the current track area the building will be added at a later date. This project is now prioritized over the soccer field project. Communication to the Madison Park HOA on this potential construction and woods removal would be very important to conduct and have been requested.
- The Tennis court project is moving along and will hopefully be ready in the spring. Field
 House construction for the Tennis courts will take longer. Queens is open to adding back
 Landscaping on the back portion of the area where the woods was removed to aid with
 sound and light reduction for the bordering neighborhood property's.

- Cross Country course is still in the plan and could potentially get moved up given its
 impact on connectivity to the Cross Charlotte Trial and usage of a potential greenway
 track of Little Hope Creek greenway. The Cross Country track would use existing pathed
 paths and create new natural paths out of wood chips as much as possible to complete
 the course. Stacy will be contacting the Greenway folks from Parks and Rec to ensure
 they know of the potential double usage of the Little Hope Creek Greenway path.
- The Cut Through project on Tyvola Road is still under discussion and Queens supports this effort to aid in traffic in and out of the Complex.
 - Update 9-9-16 Trees have been removed On Tyvola across from the entrance to the Queens Complex which is seemingly for a parking lot area for the Little Sugar Creek Greenway trial
