# **President's Report**

 Jason Roberts, the Organizer of the Better Block Project - an organization focused on helping local communities use their ideas, talents, and resources to make positive changes in their neighborhood will be speaking tomorrow July 11th at the McGlohon Theatre at Spirit Square at 345 North College Street. # **Speakers**

Laura Reid Dukes, Assistant City Arborist

Laura did open her discussion fielding questions from neighbors about canker worms and the tree banding efforts across the city. We did have a very mild canker work population in 2017 and entemologists believe this is due to the mild winter we had followed by the freeze in February. It is still important that we continue banding efforts to keep the canker work population in our neighborhood at bay.

The heart of Laura's talk was about the Emerald Ash Borer. The federal government recently confirmed that pockets of Charlotte are positive for Emerald Ash Borer beetles.

This beetle was first found in 2002 in Detroit, MI. It's a small beetle that is bright metallic green. They only lay eggs on ash trees. The baby grubs eat or "girdle" the nutrient dense layer of the tree and the tree can't move water and nutrients from the roots up or from the leaves down. Once infested it takes 8-10 years for the tree to die. It dies from the top down.

This beetle is native to Japan and China. In their native countries this beetle isn't killing trees like they do here because the trees have natural defenses and they have wasps that keep the species in check. Wasps have been released in the U.S. to help combat these beetles. Woodpeckers will eat them, but it isn't enough to impact the beetle population.

If you do have an ash tree in your yard, there are insecticides that can be used to treat the tree. There are 2 modalities for treating your ash trees; one method is having a certified arborist inject the pesticide in the tree and the second neighbors can do on their own. You can get the materials at your local Lowe's or Home Depot.

This year's tree banding grant application process will also include funds for the Emerald Ash Borer beetle. Neighborhoods will still get \$3,000. Money can be split between both canker work and emerald ash borer treatments or neighborhoods can pick a single population (canker worm or Emerald Ash Borer beetle) to treat. Carly will learn about this new option at this week's tree banding grant seminar. (Thank you Carly!!!!)
